

Operators of regular passenger train services in Benelux 2021

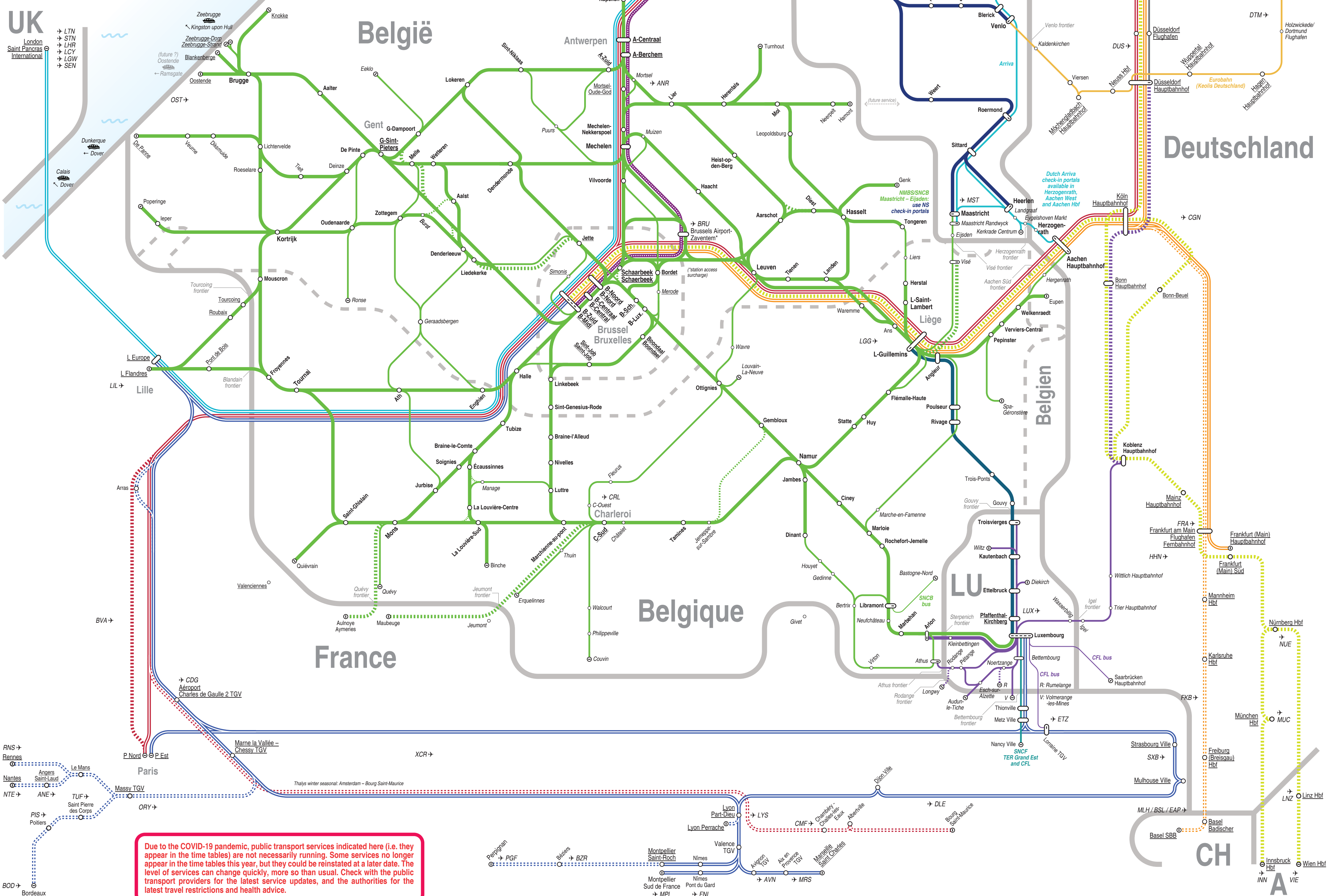
Regular rail services:
 — high-speed
 — semi-high-speed
 — long-distance; local rail services often also run on this route
 — local only
 high-speed rail services: at least two services in each direction per day Monday to Friday
 other rail services: at least 1 service every 2 hours in each direction continuously during and between peak hours (day time) Monday to Friday
 Limited service:
 ····· high-speed
 ····· semi-high-speed
 ····· long-distance (including some long-distance Belgian P trains)
 ····· local only

High-speed rail services:
 — Eurostar: England – France – Belgium – Netherlands
 — Thalys: France – Belgium – Netherlands / Germany
 — TGV (by Thalys): Low-cost Paris – Brussels service (partially non-high-speed)
 — ICE International: Netherlands – Germany (– Switzerland), Belgium – Germany
 — TGV: France – Belgium / Luxembourg
 Semi-high-speed rail services:
 — InterCity Amsterdam/The Hague – Rotterdam – Breda – Brussels
 — InterCity direct: NS nomenclature for services via the Schiphol – Rotterdam high-speed line

Non-high-speed rail services:
 — Nederlandse Spoorwegen (NS): InterCity (long-distance), Sprinter (all-stops)
 — R-net, run by NS: Sprinter (all-stops)
 — R-net, run by Obuzz: Stoptrein (all-stops)
 — Blaauwnet
 — Arriva: Shettrain / RE (intermediate), Stoptrein / RS (all-stops)
 — Breng (Connexxion): Stoptrein (all-stops)
 — Valleilijn, run by Connexxion: Stoptrein (all-stops)
 — InterCity Amsterdam – Berlin, run jointly by NS and Deutsche Bahn
 — DB Regio: RE (intermediate), RB (all-stops)
 — Eurobahn / Keolis Deutschland: RE (intermediate), RB (all-stops)
 — Abellio: RE (intermediate)
 — Nationale Maatschappij der Belgische Spoorwegen / Société nationale des chemins de fer belges (NMBS/SNCB):
 — InterCity (long-distance), L (all-stops), S (all-stops),
 — ICT (seasonal long-distance), P (supplementary long-distance or local)
 — Société Nationale des Chemins de Fer Luxembourgeois (CFL):
 — InterCity (long-distance), RE (intermediate), RB (all-stops)
 — InterCity Liège – Luxembourg, run jointly by NMBS/SNCB and CFL
 — TER, run jointly by Société nationale des chemins de fer français (SNCF) and CFL
 — Österreichische Bundesbahnen (ÖBB): Nightjet (sleeper)

◊ Name station served only by regular local rail service
 ○ Name station served only by InterCity and/or high-speed rail service
 ◊ Name station served by both InterCity/high-speed and Dutch/Belgian/Luxembourgish local services
 ◊ Name station with metro / pre-metro / S-Bahn / U-Bahn / Stadtbahn / light-rail / tram / funicular connections
 ↻ train reverses out of a station
